



TEBAY ANGLERS' NEWSLETTER 2021

Dear Members, Permit Holders & Friends

1. Sadly, I must report the passing of Jack Parsley, a Roundthwaite farmer and supporter of the Club. Our thoughts are with his family and friends.
2. The Club has held fees at the 2008 level for another year. **Remember that annual fees are due by 1st April.** Details of fees and payment methods can be found at www.tebayanglers.com. Fees for 2022 will be set after the committee has had a chance to review this year's balance sheet.
3. **There are no permit fees for anyone aged 16 and below, but ages 12-16 must carry an EA licence.**
4. Former permit holders may return without imposition of a second entrance fee.
5. **There will be no AGM and Dinner** this year due to COVID-19 restriction; there is presently nowhere in the village where even the committee can safely meet. However, donations instead of auction lots would be appreciated.
6. Submission of catch returns continues to be poor at under 61% for 2021, despite a continued fall in permits issued (28). **Please remember that the Committee has authorised that a fine can be levied for failure to submit a catch return, payable before the issue of your next permit;** nil returns to my answerphone continue to be acceptable. 2021 as we know was an exceptional with numerous and varying travel restrictions; Angling Trust did manage to get fishing recognised as legitimate exercise, limited to reasonable travel distances.
7. Fish reported caught took a bit of a hit. Salmon were down to 28, just above 2018's total; largest at 19lbs. **Don't forget that the EA requires "Catch & Release" on the Lune.** Sea Trout actually showed an upturn to 69, with one person making a significant contribution to the numbers: to the annoyance of others drawing blanks. Brownies fell surprisingly to a mere 76. Ability to attend as often as usual may have been a factor. However, there were comments about not sighting many and the worst brown trout season in years.
8. Please encourage friends and relations to join us as we presently have vacancies for 2021. If full, we then operate a waiting list, so contact **HAROLD RILEY (01671 401173) (Harold.riley949@gmail.com)** to find out the current situation. **The "Bring a Friend" scheme continues in 2021** (Details on website).



9. Day/Week Tickets are available (1st April – 30th September) which can be used to introduce your friends to our waters. **October, and salmon fishing** are, however, still the exclusive preserve of Members and Season Permit Holders. In clarification, to avoid other incidents, exchange tickets are valid for the season specified in the respective club's rules; 1st April to 31st October for us.
10. **I would be most grateful for your email address if you have one.** Postage charges now cost the income from 3 members' permits, and I would like to get news out more than once a year.
11. Tight lines for the fishing season ahead.
12. **Permit holders may fish from 18th March each year.** Brown trout on fly only to 1st May. Please ensure you obtain your permit before you fish.
